Board Dismissal for Lack of Jurisdiction

On May 31, 2012, Petitioner Don C. Newport, III., filed a complaint before the State Labor Relations Board ("Board"), pursuant to COMAR 14.32.05. In his complaint, Mr. Newport alleged that the above named Respondent had neglected to compensate him based upon a policy that he alleged would bring him retroactive pay to a point in time when he was employed by the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA).

Petitioner's complaint is deficient in that the State Labor Relations Board does not have jurisdiction over those employed by the MTA. State Personnel & Pension Article §3-102(b)(1) states:

- (b) This title does not apply to:
 - (1) Employees of the Maryland Transit Administration, as that term is defined in §7-601(a)(2) of the Transportation Article.

The Transportation Article referenced here indicates that employees are "those employees who are validly represented by an accredited representative." The Article continues, providing information about labor concerns and dispute management and resolution procedures. Petitioner may be permitted to seek relief under the procedures outlined in the Transportation Article, see, for example, Section 7-602 – "Arbitration in labor disputes." The SLRB is limited by statutory provisions, and cannot provide the relief sought by Mr. Newport.

Accordingly, this complaint is dismissed, because of lack of Board jurisdiction to consider the complaint.
