Board Dismissal for Lack of Jurisdiction

On March 12, 2020, Petitioner Tammy Lynn Hamilton ("Hamilton") filed an unfair labor practice complaint before the State Labor Relations Board ("Board"), pursuant to COMAR 14.32.05. In her complaint, Hamilton alleges that her employer, the United States Postal Service ("USPS"), did not compensate her for attendance at a training academy.

State Personnel & Pensions (SPP) Article § 3-102(a) sets forth, by unit, which State Government employees are subject to Maryland's collective bargaining law. Employees of the USPS are not included in any of the units described in this Section.

Accordingly, Hamilton's complaint is dismissed due to lack of Board jurisdiction.
